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- Remember that hollow adherence to sound doctrine has always been despicable to God (Micah 6:6-8, Amos 5:21-24, Hosea 6:6).



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- Genesis 15:6 is frequently used by NT writers to prove a gigantic point, though it is a very small piece of information (Gal. 3:6, Ja. 2:23, Rom. 4:3, 4:9–10)
